



About Us

- Our school is located in the suburb of Wallsend and has a proud history of having provided more than 150 years of public education to the community. We proudly acknowledge that we teach and learn on Awabakal land. Plattsburg has an average population of 210 with 26% identifying as Aboriginal and 19% as having a non-English speaking background. Aboriginal and EALD representation is steady across the last 3 consecutive years.
- The school has a strong focus on providing individualised learning opportunities for students to achieve. This includes significant access to technology, cultural experiences and alternative play opportunities.



Best Start Assessment

The Best Start Kindergarten Assessment is a state-wide assessment that helps show teachers the Literacy and Numeracy skills of each student at the beginning of Kindergarten.

It provides teachers with useful information to help support your child's learning at school and provides parents and caregivers with feedback on what their child can do, and how they can best support their child's learning.

Best Start begins with the teacher interviewing each child at the beginning of the Kindergarten year. The assessment does not require the student to prepare or study.

The assessment takes about 20 minutes each for the Literacy and Numeracy parts.

The assessment is conducted one-on-one by either your child's Kindergarten teacher or a Plattsburg PS staff member in a supportive environment within the school.






Best Start Assessment

Children complete the tasks individually while the teacher observes and records the child's responses.


Literacy - identifies a range of skills such as word, sound and letter recognition, early writing abilities and ability to retell story lines from books that are read to them.


Numeracy - the tasks are related to early number concepts and identify a range of skills such as number recognition, counting, early addition and subtraction skills and ability to recognise repeating patterns.






Academic Goals - Reading - Mid Year





Each screener from Levels 1-4 requires students to decode both real and nonsense (pseudo) words. Nonsense words are phonically decodable words that are not actual words with an associated meaning. The inclusion of these words in the screener allows for a true test of decoding to be undertaken.


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



Writing mid-year






Academic Goals - Writing

Academic Goals - Numeracy

Mid Year Goals

- Recognise and identify numbers 0-10

- Identify the numbers that come just before and just after a given number in the range 0-10 (without dropping back to count from 1).

End Year Goals

- Recognises and identifies all numbers in the range 0-30 as well as 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, 70, 80, 90 and 100.
- Counts to at least 30.
- Produces the number words just after or just before a given number in the range 1 30 (without dropping) back to count from 1)








Learning and Support


