






Grammar Revision

WILF: Write a verb in the bubble to match the action it is pointing to in the picture.




Reading

Read an imaginative text aloud.


Act out your favourite part of the book to an adult. Bonus points for changing your voice to sound like the character. You will need to practise 5 times before telling an adult you are ready.








Grammar Revision

Adverbs tell us more about the action/ doing word/ verb. Adverbs often end with ly.


I can write an adverb that tell me HOW each action was done. WILF: Write an adverb in the bubble describe how the action happened.





Sand, Waves and Ice Cream


There are 8 differences in the pictures below, can you find them all?
