



#### Grammar

#### Pronouns

A pronoun is a short word that takes the place of the noun (person or people).

I can write a new ending for my text.


WILF: Write a new ending for your book that solves the main problem for your character. Draw a picture to match your new ending.

I can write the pronoun that matches with its noun.


