The oldest female elephant is the boss of the herd. She leads the way.





Pokémon Animation

The animated TV show 'Pokemon the Series' features the adventures of Ash and his Pokemon best friend Pikachu, along with many other friends and Pokemon. Their story has also extended to include a series of full-length animated films.

> **Pokémon Trading Card Game** The Pokémon Trading Card Game lets players collect and build decks of cards to use in games to 'battle'. Each card depicts a Pokémon along with information or 'stats' about that Pokémon.



Pokémon Video Games There are many different Pokémon—themed video games. Some are very detailed role play and quest games, while others are quick and simple puzzle games.




