



Compound words

A compound word is made when two words are joined to form a new word that has a new meaning.

Some compound words are single words: (honeycomb, football, eggcup, bedroom).

Some compound words are hyphenated: (mother-in-law, close-up, u-turn, merry-go-round)

Some compound words have a space between them, but when read together they have a new meaning: (high school, hot dog, ice cream, full moon).





lcebergs are huge masses of ice made from fresh water that have broken off the areas of ice near the North or South Pole. Icebergs from the South Pole can be many times larger than those near the North

Pole. When we see pictures of icebergs we do not really see their true size. Only about one-seventh of any iceberg is above the water. This is the only part we see.

Icebergs can be very dangerous to ships. At night or during a heavy fog, ships can easily run into them and be sunk. One of the greatest sea disasters was caused by an iceberg. The largest ship of the time, the *Titanic*, ran into an iceberg on her first voyage on 14 April 1912. More than 1 500 people died.

People can do little to control icebergs because of their size. They are hard to destroy by blasting and, because the ice beneath the surface of the water can easily tear the bottom of a boat open, attempting to tow them away is very dangerous.





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Echidna

The echidna is a highly adaptable creature that can be found throughout Australia. They are found in coastal forests, alpine meadows and deserts. The echidna has the widest distribution of any native Australian mammal.



The echidna has a skinny snout and a long flicking tongue which is perfect for catching insects. It also has very sharp spines, known as quills, along its back and sides.

When an echidna is threatened, it will curl inwards leaving only its quills exposed. This is a form of protection from predators. Termites and ants are what echidnas love to eat.

They especially love eating beetle larvae which are a type of soil invertebrate. Their sharp claws are what help them to find termites, as they often hide in rotting logs.
