


Spelling Focus

Double consonant in 2 syllable words. (dd and tt)

Double consonants in the middle of a word mark the boundary of two syllables (sum-mer).

A double consonant follows the short vowel (fitter).

I can break a word into syllables.

WILF: Put your hand on your chin and say each word slowly. Where your mouth closes, draw a line through the word to show the syllable (chunk of sound).

EXAMPLE:

hotter = hot ter, fitter = fit ter, cuddle = cud dle
