

Figures of speech

Figures of speech use words to create particular visual images and sound effects.

Visual / Language devices	
simile A direct comparison using the words as or like.	He was as rich as King Midas. The soldier stood rigid like a tree.
metaphor A comparison where one thing is said to be something else.	The man was a rock when things got difficult. The children are little treasures.
personification Human qualities are given to inanimate objects.	The trees were dancing with the wind. The flowers begged for water.
anthropomorphism Human qualities are given to animals. Used in many books, animations and cartoons.	'I don't like carrots,' said the baby rabbit. The fox was wearing a beautiful, tweed jacket with a yellow bow tie.

Word play	
pun A clever play on words involving the multiple meanings of an expression, or two expressions that sound similar.	I'm drawn to art. I need to look for my watch, but I don't have the time.
rhetorical questions A question not expecting an answer, but done for emphasis or effect.	Why do we allow the media to decide what is the perfect body shape?
spoonerism A mix up of the initial sounds of spoken words.	You've tasted two worms. (You've wasted two terms.) I'm fighting a liar. (I'm lighting a fire.)
malapropism The unintentional use of incorrect, similar sounding words.	Our home is skirt by sea. (Our home is girt by sea.)



contradictions	
irony Implies the opposite of what is actually said.	This explanation is crystal clear.
sarcasm Similar to irony but is used to humiliate, hurt or insult.	Obviously you put in a tremendous effort to come last in the race.
oxymoron Puts two contradictory words next to each other.	The silence was deafening in the waiting room.

exaggeration or understatement	
hyperbole An exaggeration aiming at humour or emphasis.	The cook made enough food to feed an army. My bag weighs a tonne.
euphemism The substitution of something pleasant or agreeable for something that may offend.	She passed away yesterday. They lost their lives in the war.
