## SPinS Speech Pathology Program



We are Lauren, Jessie, Miza & Chai! We are from Newcastle University, here for the Speech Pathology in Schools program (SPinS) at Plattsburg Public School.

The SPinS program provides:

- Accessible speech pathology services for school-aged children with communication difficulties
- Opportunities for clinical education placements for speech pathology students

We will be collaborating with the school team and our clinical educator, Isabelle, throughout term 3 and 4.

We are working with kindergarten, year 1 and year 2 students. Our service involves assessment, followed by supportive approaches for students which may include classroom based, group and individual therapy options.

We look forward to getting to know the school team and students! We will be at school every Thursday if you want to say hi or if you have any questions for us.

During Term 3 and Term 4 1/2S students have been working with SPINS in order to build on their language skills. We have loved having them in our classroom.

## Circle of Security

At times all parents feel lost or without a clue about what our child might need from us. Imagine what it might feel like if you were able to make sense of what your child was really asking from you. The Circle of Security® Parenting™ program is based on decades of research about how secure parent-child relationships can be supported and strengthened. Using the COS-P model developed by the Circle of Security originators, our trained Facilitators work with parents and care-givers to help them to:

- Understand their child's emotional world by learning to read emotional needs.
- Support their child's ability to successfully manage emotions
- Enhance the development of their child's self esteem.

- Honour the innate wisdom and desire for their child to be secure.

## Selective High School Test 2021

Selective high schools cater for high achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing education materials at the appropriate level. Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 12th March 2020. If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2021, you need to apply online at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-highschools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7> (you need to apply using a valid email address, not the student's email address).

Applications for selective high school placement opened on 8th October 2019 and will close on 11th November 2019. You must apply before the closing date. There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance after 8 October

2019. You must submit only ONE application for each student. Please make sure you meet the deadline as late applications are not accepted.

## Scholarships

Learning For Life Scholarships are now available. Meeting the costs of education can be tough. The Smith Family is offering education scholarships to assist your family to cover these costs and to help your children to get the most out of their education. If you are in possession of a Health Care Card or Pension Concession Card, and your child has excellent attendance, you are eligible to apply for a place on the Learning for Life Scholarship Program. Please contact the office for a referral form as soon as possible. The Smith Family will be in touch to arrange a scholarship interview with you, and you will be eligible for your first payment in January 2020.

## Intention to apply for Year 7 entry to a selective high school in 2021

Dear Parent/Carer

Selective high schools cater for academically high potential and gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates of their own academic standard. Selective schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, using specialised teaching methods and materials.

Selective high schools are unzoned so parents can apply regardless of where they live. Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on **Thursday 12 March 2020**.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2021, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from late-September 2019 at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7>.

The application website opens at that link on **8 October 2019** and closes at **10pm on 11 November 2019**. **You must apply before the closing date.**

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance after 8 October 2019.

You must submit only **ONE** application for each student.


